Transcript/Diploma/Certificate Financial Hold Exemption Policy

A. Purpose

This policy is established in response to Colorado House Bill 22-1049 to outline the conditions under which Apex College of Veterinary Technology may withhold transcripts, diplomas, or certificates due to financial obligations, as well as the process for exemptions.

B. Scope

This policy applies to all current and former students, except foreign students as defined in C.R.S. 23-1-113.5, who owe outstanding debt for tuition, room and board, or financial aid funds and request a transcript, diploma, or certificate.

C. Policy

1. Financial Hold Conditions

Apex College of Veterinary Technology may place a hold on transcripts, diplomas, or certificates when a student has an outstanding financial obligation related to tuition, room and board, or other fees. The hold is applied under the following conditions:

- o Payment is overdue beyond the due date specified in the Enrollment Agreement.
- Debts exceeding \$250 are eligible for third-party collection assignment after 60 days of non-payment.

Students with financial holds will not be able to access their official transcripts, diplomas, or certificates unless an exemption applies (outlined below).

2. Exemptions

Students or former students may request an exemption to release transcripts, diplomas, or certificates if the documentation is required for:

- o Job application
- o Transfer to another postsecondary institution

- o Application for state, federal, or institutional financial aid
- o Opportunities within the military or national guard
- o Pursuit of other postsecondary education opportunities

3. Process for Requesting an Exemption

- Students must submit a written request for the release of their transcripts/diplomas/certificates, along with supporting documentation demonstrating the need for an exemption as outlined above.
- o Apex College will review the exemption request and issue a written decision within **seven business days**.
- o If approved, the requested document(s) will be released promptly. If denied, a written explanation will be provided.

4. Registration Holds

Students with outstanding debts will not be allowed to register for future courses or classes until the debt is settled. A hold will be placed on course registration for any amount of outstanding debt until full payment is made.

5. Payment Plans

Students with outstanding debts may request a payment plan. To establish a payment plan, students should contact the **Apex College of Veterinary Technology** at:

6. Third-Party Collections

When debts remain unpaid for **60 days**, they may be referred to a third-party collection agency. Once in collections, the student must resolve the debt directly with the collection agency to remove any financial holds.

7. Complaints and Dispute Resolution
